






Below are the state maps breakdown by band.




80 Meter Phone, 33 States Worked, 3 Canadian Provinces




80 Meter CW, 22 States Worked, 3 Canadian Provinces










160 meter CW. 17 States, 2 Provinces.




160 meter phone. 2 states.











40 meter phone 16 states.




40 CW 20 States, 4 Provinces, and France DX











20 meter phone 23 states, 4 Canadian provinces, 2 DX












#### FIRST CONTACT AWARDED FOR WINTER FIELD DAY





Notes. Arrived at 1130 utc no propo to stateside and UBA contest in full swing. At 1300 UBA contest ended. CHU 14670 was fading in. Band opened to USA about 1315. Big US stations doing normal DXing were very good. FD stations were lower down with some QSB. More stations logged this year compared to 2019.

We were heard in the UK by operator M1ELK. To the left is his SWL report. This report is from the Winter Field Day Facebook group. Spotter was M1ELK. He heard us mobile in his car on Sunday. M1ELK is in Swallowfield, England. This is west of London & just south of Reading. Thanx Brandon KB1THM.











#### **BALLOONING**






# IT'S TIME TO PARTY! 2020 IS OUR CLUB'S 25<sup>TH</sup> (SILVER) ANNIVERSARY!
