#### ARRL DX SSB CONTEST

We operated the ARRL DX SSB contest on Saturday afternoon March 7, 2020 for about 6 hours. Dave KB1LTW and Ned KA1CVv arrived at WAS around 12:50 pm and began setting up. Gary WE1M arrived about 20 minutes later. Using the IC-7300 and the Ameritron we operated a single transmitter, multi operator, high power station running approximately 300 watts. (The Ameritron needs new tubes).

We ran both the Vertical antenna and the OCF dipole and switched between them via a coax switch in the tuner. A short time later, Alex N1AK and Dan N3DAW arrived to join us. How did we do? Take a look at our certificate below. We placed First in CT and 4<sup>th</sup> in New England in Multi Op, Single Transmitter, High Power Category! Thanks to all who contributed to this fine effort (and apologies to N1AK for inadvertently leaving his callsign off our submittal. Mea Culpa - WE1M).



#### SUMMER FIELD DAY

We operated Summer Field Day June 26-27, 2020 from WAS as a 2A CT station. N1KT was used. The entire operation was headed by Dave KB1LTW and Jeff KB1LZ. Helping them operate were Sam W1SMF, Larry AB1JC, Ken NE1CU, Ned KA1CVv, Mike KA1EOU, Jim WJ1M, Ryan KC3NJF and Brandon KB1THM. Because N3FJP was having trouble with the new Windows 10 filesharing security, each of the two stations maintained their own logging software and database. This was manageable as the stations were set up mutually exclusive by band. Below is the analysis of both of those stations (combined together). We also asked members who worked their own stations from home to submit their scores and allocate them to our club's overall score. Thank you to N3DAW and WE1M who did so. However, those contacts and logs are not included in this analysis below. Only our two club stations operating N1KT are included.

First let's talk about the bands. On Saturday, it seems that the bands were antagonistic to us and laughing whilst doing so. Gary WE1M (100 watts) operated for 10 hours from home on 20 and 40 phone and only made 20 contacts. Likewise, Douglas WA1SFH had only made 3 contacts. At WAS, N1KT station A had made only 80 contacts (with high power) while N1KT station B had made only 29 contacts, again with high power. But the bands would change. On Sunday, Station A made 309 contacts and Station B would make 39 more contacts. By the end of the contest, Station A had made 389 contacts while Station B would make 68 total contacts. This gave us a total of 389 + 68 = 457 contacts.




Both Stations combined










15 meters phone (18 states, 1 DX)




20 meters digital (6 states, 1 DX)











20 meters phone (9 states, 2 Canadian provinces)



40 meters (not metes) digital (5 states, 2 Canadian provinces)











40 meters phone (25 states, 4 Canadian provinces)



80 meters digital (11 states)











80 meters phone (24 states, 2 Canadian provinces)

20 meters didn't seem to work all that well. It had trouble getting out past the Mississippi river. 15 meters seems to have the favored propagation that weekend, as we worked 5 states past the river with 40 meter phone right behind it with 4 states. 80 meter phone gave us most of New England 1 land so it was a worthy effort there. The sad bands/modes were 40 meters digital with only 4 states, and 20 meters phone with only 9 states. There was no really clear winning band or mode. It was one of those Field Days where every contact on every band on every mode counted. The marginal utility of each individual contact was high! Put them all together and we get the WAS Combined Band and Mode map above. We worked 38 states, 7 Canadian Provinces and 2 DX countries (YV Venezuela on 20 digital, and CX Uraguay on 15 phone) both South America.

We have had better Field Days, but given that we only had two stations, our problems with Windows file sharing, and having our first (and hopefully last) "Social Distancing" Field day, we really did a bang-up job! We can all be proud of our effort. I dare to say more effort went into this year's Summer Field Day than any other. Obstacles were thrown at us at almost every step of the contest, yet members stepped-up and attacked with hard work and teamwork. We analyzed, adapted and overcame! Congratulations to the entire club on a job Well Done!

Tuesday August 4, 2020.






Close up of our antenna damage.
